January 2022

Summary: Below is a summary of Public Works actions for the month:

### 1. Finance, Budget & Procurement

- a. Receive 2 new BAD BOYZ lawn mowers from grove Equipment Services that will be used by PW/Utilities in all future grass cutting for the city.
- b. Receive quote from Weikert Ford for purchase of 2022 F250 Work Truck. Prepared documentation for approval by the City Commission on 18 JAN 22. Waiting for Ford to determine if they can produce truck based on supply shortages.
- c. Received quote for new 44-inch Lane Shark Brush Cutter from Grove Equipment and purchased. Equipment is installed and ready for use.
- d. Met with NAPA representative at Public Works Department to discuss new 4 post vehicle lift. Received quote and processed PO. Will set date to get installed in maintenance bay.

### 2. Admin, Logistics & Operations

- a. Finalized procurement actions associated with 20x30 PW/Utilities Shed.
- b. All 5 PW employees were absent during a portion of the month due to testing positive for COVID-19. All recovered and returned.
- c. Public Works Director completed 30 days initial expectations/counseling with all employees.
- d. Processed Accounts Payable for the week including outstanding UniFirst August 2021 invoice, ACE Hardware billing, WEX Card, and Lowe's invoice.
- Conducted Unifirst synchronization discussion to ensure uniform exchange and procedures were understood and followed. Will brief Utilities Director as well as PW Team to ensure all are informed.
- f. Contacted Mobile-One regarding the purchase of new 6 bank radio charger to replace the worn-out original chargers purchased in 2018. Equipment was purchased and all radios are charging properly.
- g. Contacted Detective regarding fraudulent activity on Home Depot account. Detective indicated that suspects have been identified, questioned, and pending charges.
- h. Completed the inventory of all excess/surplus items located at the Old Public Works Bldg. Completed PW Surplus list was turned into the City Manager week of 3 FEB 22 for City Commission to review and approve for surplus.

#### 3. Streets & Signs

a. Completed surveillance of city signs and updated in DIAMOND MAPS.
 Ordered \$2800.00 worth of replacement signs and parts to begin the

- process of replacing old and damaged signs and posts. New signs are on hand and will begin to replace over the month of March.
- b. Repaired street signs and added to the top of the stop sign at SR 33, Citrus Grove Blvd and Sunshine Blvd.
- Removed & replaced children at play sign located at Oak Ave and 2<sup>nd</sup> Street.
- Validated all city streets have been uploaded and accurate into DIAMOND MAPS.
- e. Conducted surveillance of Oakridge Heights streets to determine the requirement for paving. Surveillance resulted in the determination that roads do not require paving which will result in a potential \$50,000 cost avoidance.
- f. Coordinated with FLDOT regarding sidewalk repairs along SR33 in front of Polk City Elementary. FLDOT completed repairs on 28 JAN 22. Awaiting assessment from FLDOT on cracked sidewalk along SR33 and west of Bronson Community Center.
- g. Assisted Utilities Department with the repair of broken water line and hydrant replacement at the corner of Oak Ave & Railroad Ave. Pavement repair quotes are being received and will be present to City Manager for her approval upon final quote receipt.

#### 4. Stormwater

- a. Received confirmation from to Matt Irwin, FDEP NPDES Stormwater Program Inspector regarding 3 DEC DEP MS4 Audit Assessment. Based on the City's response and a review of the information submitted the facility was determined to be in compliance with Department rules and regulations. The Audit is closed, and Polk City is in compliance.
- Added all 15 industrial, commercial, and institutional organizations within Polk City Limits into DIAMOND MAPS as part of the MS4 Surveillance Plan.
- Completed 1<sup>st</sup> QTR, 2022 MS4 Surveillance of the 15 industrial, commercial, and institutional organizations with no deficiencies noted.
- d. Performed Illicit Discharge surveillance at a home located at 607<sup>th</sup> & 3rd Street. Results were reported to Code Enforcement who issued a citation. Violation was fixed by homeowner and closed by Code Enforcement.
- e. Conducted site survey of stormwater ditch in Oakridge Heights between 2nd & 3rd Street bordering 607th 2nd Street residence that cleaned up an illicit discharge. Property is not owned by city, so if ditch is to be filled in with pipe and backfill, will have to factor into FY2022-2023 Budget and get permission of homeowner if approved by City Manager and City Commission.
- f. Conducted site survey of city stormwater ditch located at intersection of 2nd Street and Oak Ave to plan cleanup to increase water flow and prevent stoppage of flush in the event of heavy rainfall.
- g. Assigned both Dustin Williams and Luis Castro to prepare for the online SEP 22 Stormwater, Erosion & Sedimentation Control Inspector Training

Program. Keith McVeigh is signed up for the MAR 22 online class/certification.

### ANALYSIS:

Currently, information regarding municipal elections is in the Charter as well in Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances (Chapter 2 has various subject matters).

This Ordinance will create a separate chapter in the Code of Ordinances dealing with nothing but elections and what Polk City's guidelines are; i.e.

- Qualification deadline for candidates for elected city office
- · Prohibited voting conflict on city canvassing board

Having a separate chapter makes it easier for those who are interested in running as well as city staff looking for information.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt Ordinance 2022-01 on First Reading

### ORDINANCE 2022-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF POLK CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE POLK CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES (THE "CITY CODE") CREATING CHAPTER 9 IN THE CITY CODE; CREATING A CITY ELECTION CODE; AMENDING & RENUMBERING §§ 2-11 AND 2-12 OF THE CITY CODE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, & AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF POLK CITY, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. COMMISSION FINDINGS. In adopting this Ordinance and modifying the Polk City Code and the therein-incorporated Unified Land Development Code, the City Commission of Polk City, Florida, hereby makes the following findings:

- (1) Article II of the Polk City Charter (the "City Charter") provides for the establishment of regular elections and the creation of city commission districts.
- (2) Article VI of the City Charter provides certain rules for nominations and city elections.
- (3) Section C-30 of the City Charter provides that the "provisions of the general laws of the State of Florida pertaining to state and municipal elections relating to the qualifications of electors, registrations, manner of voting, duties of election officers, canvassing of returns and all other particulars in respect to the management of elections, except as otherwise provided in this Charter and ordinances adopted hereunder pertaining to elections, shall, so far as the same may be applicable, govern all City elections."
- (4) From time to time, the City Commission finds that neither the State Election Code nor the City Charter provide the necessary provisions to guide the City in its conduct of elections.
- (5) The City Commission finds it necessary and prudent to establish a city election code which may be expanded or amended going forward in order to set forth necessary clarifying provisions.

SECTION 2. CREATION OF CHAPTER 9 "ELECTION CODE", POLK CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES. Chapter 9 of the Code of Ordinances, Polk City, Florida, is hereby created to read as follows:

"Chapter 9 - ELECTIONS

Sec. 9-1. - Effect of State Election Code.

Election matters not covered by the City Charter or this Code shall be

covered and controlled by the Florida Election Code, Chapters 97-106, Fla. Stat.

Sec. 2-11 9-2. Qualification deadline for candidates for elected city office.

The city hereby establishes the following deadline for submittals of completed qualification packages for qualification for any elected office in the city. incorporating the provisions of F.S. § 99.061, and specifically, F.S. § 99.061(2), which states: (2) The provisions of any special act to the contrary notwithstanding, each person seeking to qualify for nomination or election to a county office, or district or special district city office not covered by subsection (1), shall file his or her qualification papers with, and pay the qualifying fee, which shall consist of the filing fee and election assessment, and party assessment, if any has been levied, to, the supervisor of elections of the county city manager/city clerk, or shall qualify by the alternative method with the supervisor of elections city manager/city clerk, at any time after 1:00 p.m. of the first day for which shall be the 50th day prior to the earlier of the first primary or special district-regular election, but not later than 1:00 p.m. of the 47th day prior to the earlier of the date of the first primary or special district regular election. However, if a special district election is held at the same time as the second primary or general election, qualifying shall be the 50th day prior to the first primary, but not later than 1:00 p.m. of the 47th day prior to the date of the first primary. Within 30 days after the closing of qualifying time, the supervisor of elections shall remit to the secretary of the state executive committee of the political party to which the candidate belongs the amount of the filing fee, two thirds of which shall be used to promote the candidacy of candidates for county offices and the candidacy of members of the legislature.

Sec. 2.12 9.3 Prohibited voting conflict on city canvassing board.

Pursuant to state law and based upon the legislative findings set forth in the above-stated recitals, the City Council Commission of Polk City hereby adopts the following ordinance. By virtue of a pending election and the harm to public health and safety by virtue of the lack of a specific prohibition on a sitting city-council commission member being able to vote to certify his or her own election, it is necessary for the city to amend its City Code of Ordinance. The city council commission hereby determines that a sitting city-council commission member who is running for reelection against another candidate may continue to sit upon the city canvassing board, but shall not vote to certify the results of the election in which that city-council Commission member is seeking to be reelected. Any city council Commission member may vote upon the issue of certification of election results in any race or election in which they themselves are not a candidate for reelection. The purpose of this prohibition is to avoid the appearance of a conflict of interest by the members of the city canvassing board."

**SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY.** If any provision of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of any other provision, and to that end, the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared severable.

Polk City previously consented to the inclusion of its territorial boundaries into the Polk County Fire Service MSBU by Ordinance No. 2-1297 on January 14, 2013. The County has requested that Polk City renew and extend its consent to inclusion in the Polk County Fire Service MSBU for purposes of providing fire services with the municipal boundaries of the City for another term of ten (10) years.

The fire station is currently inside of the city limits, and the city is currently working with Polk County to relocate the fire station, which would keep it inside the city limits. This is a benefit for the citizens and businesses.

### ORDINANCE 2022-02

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF POLK CITY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING A SHORT TITLE; PROVIDING FOR INTENT, PURPOSE, & EFFECT; CONSENTING TO THE INCLUSION OF THE ENTIRE TERRITORY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY INTO A POLK COUNTY MUNICIPAL SERVICE BENEFIT UNIT; PROVIDING FOR INTENT, PURPOSE AND EFFECT; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT, SEVERABILITY, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 125.01(1)(q) and (r), Florida Statutes, the Florida Legislature has empowered counties to establish Municipal Service Benefit Units (MSBU), wherein a County may levy non-ad valorem assessments to cover the cost of providing for certain municipal services, including the provision of fire services; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 125.01(1)(q), Florida Statutes, the Florida Legislature has provided that any municipality or portion thereof may be included in a County MSBU provided the municipality consents to same annually or for a period of years; and,

WHEREAS, a municipality's consent to the inclusion of its territory within a MSBU must be authorized by the enactment of an ordinance of the governing body of the municipality; and,

WHEREAS, the Polk City Commission is the governing body of Polk City, Florida ("City"); and,

WHEREAS, Polk County has created the Polk County Fire Services District as a MSBU to provide fire services within the boundaries of Polk County and within cities requesting and consenting to County fire services; and,

WHEREAS, the City previously consented to the inclusion of its territorial boundaries into the Polk County Fire Service MSBU by Ordinance No. 12-1297 on January 14, 2013; and,

WHEREAS, Polk County has requested that Polk City renew and extend its consent to inclusion in the Polk County Fire Service MSBU for purposes of providing fire services within the municipal boundaries of the City for another term of ten (10) years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF POLK CITY, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. INTENT, PURPOSE AND EFFECT. It is the intent of this Ordinance to comply with the provisions of Section 125.01(1)(q), Florida Statutes. The City Commission hereby consents to the inclusion of the land within its municipal boundaries, as they may be amended from time to time, into the Polk County Fire Services District

MSBU for a period of ten (10) years from the effective date of this ordinance for the sole and exclusive purpose of subjecting the properties therein to non-ad valorem assessments for the provision of Polk County fire services within the territorial limits of the City, including inspections and enforcement of the Florida Fire Prevention Code and Polk County Local Amendments thereto. The MSBU has been established pursuant to enabling legislation adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of Polk County.

SECTION 2. REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances (including No. 12-1297) in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

<u>SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY.</u> If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this ordinance is for any reason held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, inoperative or void, such holding shall not affect the remainder of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. TERM. This Ordinance shall remain in full effect for ten (10) years or until such time as the City repeals this Ordinance following procedures set out in Florida Statutes, Section 166.041. Notice of the proposed repeal of this Ordinance shall be provided in writing to Polk County no later than March 1 of the year in which the City intends to terminate County fire services to avoid imposition of non-ad valorem assessments for that tax year.

**SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval as a non-emergency ordinance at two regular meetings of the City Commission.

The procurement documentation submitted for DEO's review and the proposed contract with Summit Professional, Inc for administrative services was reviewed. The following finding was identified:

### ANALYSIS:

The structure at 423 Marklen Loop (Case #CE 19-0174) was inspected by Polk County and the property was condemned. Polk City went out for bid in January 2022 for demolition of the structure. Two bids were received – Johnson's Excavating Services - \$7,390 and Steve Bivens Contracting Inc - \$9,500.

Once the structure is demolished, a lien will be placed on the property for the cost of the demolition and Polk City will move forward with Foreclosure proceedings for that lien and the other lien for code infractions.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff is recommending the lowest bid from Johnson's Excavating Services in the amount of \$7,390.

### SAFETY REQUIREMENTS/REGULATIONS

- 1.0 All Bidders are required to submit, with their Bld Proposal, the Safety Requirements/Regulations form. Any questions regarding compliance with the safety requirements/regulations provision shall be directed to the City Manager at (863) 984-1375, ext. # 237.
- 1.1 The Contractor is responsible for observing all OSHA regulations and shall self-inspect to ensure this is accomplished. The Contractor shall ensure that all personnel are properly trained and shall be able to provide documentation for their personnel that have attended training courses. Examples of such training courses are: Hazard Communications, Traffic Work Zone Safety, Personal Protective Equipment, First Ald/CPR, Permit Required Confined Space, Lock out/Tag Out of Hazardous Energy. All contractors are required to comply with OSHA Standards regardless of the number of employees they may have.
- 1.2 A City representative may periodically monitor work site safety. Should therebe safety and/or health violations, classified as Serious, Willful or Criminal/Willful Violations, the County's representative may have the authority, but not the duty, to require the Contractor to correct the violation in an expeditious manner. correction may be a verbal warning and the correction shall be done the same day. Written documentation may be

maintained by the City.

Second violation:

may result in work stoppage until the violation is corrected.

The work stoppage shall not entitle the Contractor to additional contract time or compensation. Liquidated damages provision will remain in full force and effect.

Third violation:

this may constitute a breach of contract for safety violations and may result in termination of the contract at the sole discretion of the City.

Note: The County Safety Officer may stop any job to ensure the safety of all concerned.

- 1.3 Should the work site be in a hazardous area, the City shall furnish the Contractor with information concerning hazards such as types or identification of known toxic material, machine hazards, Material Safety Data Sheets, or any other information that would assist the Contractor in the planning of a safe work site.
- 1.4 The Contractor shall be aware that while working for the City, representatives from agencies such as the United States Department of Labor, Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), and the Division of Safety, State of Florida, are invitees and need not have warrants or permission to enter the work site. These agencies, as well as the County Safety Officer, enter at the pleasure of the City.
- 1.5 The Contractor shall designate a competent person of its organization whose duty shall be the prevention of accidents at the site. This person shall be the Contractor's superintendent unless otherwise designated in writing by the Contractor to the City. All communications to the superintendent shall be as binding as if given to the Contractor.



### 7.05.04 Preliminary Subdivision Plat

The developer may present a preliminary subdivision plat at any time after receiving the comments of the Development Director, the Consulting City Engineer, fire official and other City staff in response to the submission of a concept plan. The preliminary plat shall demonstrate the manner in which the comments from the concept plan review, if conducted, have been incorporated into the plat.

The purpose of the Preliminary Subdivision Plat is to provide sufficient information regarding a proposed development to enable the City to evaluate the proposed subdivision as it relates to the Comprehensive Plan and the Unified Land Development Code.

### 7.05.04.01 Submission of Preliminary Subdivision Plat

- (A) Submittal. The Preliminary Subdivision Plat review shall be initiated when the following items have been submitted:
  - Completed application forms with all necessary attachments.
  - (2) The preliminary subdivision review fee, as established by resolution of the City Council.
  - (3) Four copies of the Preliminary Subdivision Plat, a survey and a topographic map.
- (B) Required Information. The Preliminary Subdivision Plat shall be drawn to a scale appropriate to displaying the proposal on a single sheet no larger than 36" x 60" and shall include the following. If a professional is used by the applicant to obtain any of the required information, the applicant shall provide written proof of his/her professional qualifications.
  - Name, address, and telephone number of the applicant and the person preparing the plan. Provided on the Cover Page.
  - (2) Title block identifying the name and/or title of the proposed subdivision. The name shall not duplicate or closely approximate the name of any other subdivision recorded in the Public Records of Polk County, Florida. Provided on the Cover Page.
  - (3) Date, north arrow, and scale. Provided throughout the Plat pages.
  - (4) Layout of proposed streets. Provided throughout the Plat pages.
  - (5) All existing restrictions on the use of the land, including easements, rights-of-way, jurisdictional wetlands areas, either assumed or confirmed. Provided throughout the Plat pages.
  - (6) Zoning classification. Provided on the Cover Page.

### (C) Procedure.

(1) Planning Commission Action: At a properly advertised public hearing, the Planning Commission shall review exhibits, staff reports and comments by reviewing agencies and individuals and shall "approve," "approve with conditions" or "disapprove" the Preliminary Plat. Approval of the Preliminary Plat shall be deemed an expression of approval of the subdivision layout, and nothing more, and shall be reported to the City Council in the form of a discussion item for the agenda.

- (2) No improvements shall be made in the subdivision, other than clearing, grubbing and preliminary grading, until the Preliminary Plat has been approved by the Planning Commission and detailed plans for construction of improvements have been approved by the City Manager. Approval of the preliminary plat authorizes the developer to prepare construction plans for public infrastructure improvements. After approval of the construction plans by the Consulting City Engineer, the developer may proceed with construction of the infrastructure improvements.
- (3) City Council Action: The City Council shall be informed of the impending subdivision by the Development Director placing the item on the Council's agenda for discussion and information purposes.

### 7.05.04.02 Term of Preliminary Subdivision Plat

Preliminary Subdivision Plats shall remain valid for one year from the date of approval. Extensions for approval may be granted for a single period up to one year from the date the plan would otherwise expire. An extension may be granted if the Planning Commission concludes that the owners or successors of the preliminary subdivision plat have proceeded with due diligence and in good faith and the conditions have not changed substantially as to warrant a new application. All such requests for extensions shall be submitted in writing not less than 30 days before the expiration of the preliminary subdivision plat, stating the reason for the time extension request. Upon expiration of a preliminary subdivision plat, municipal services allocated thereto shall be forfeited.

Any amendment, variation or adjustment of a Preliminary Subdivision Plat shall require approval of an amended plat. The Development Director shall determine whether a proposed modification amounts to an amendment to the Preliminary Plat. The determination shall be based on, but not limited to the following: any substantial change to the plat, including increase in density, change in permitted uses, change in stormwater runoff characteristics, change in traffic patterns and trip generation, or other similar changes to the plat. The proposed amendment shall, after staff review be placed on the agenda for review and approved, approved with conditions, or disapproved.



# PEACE RIVER PROJECT INTERLOCAL WATER PLANT CONSENT AGREEMENT

THIS PEACE RIVER PROJECT INTERLOCAL WATER PLANT CONSENT AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made and entered into as of the Effective Date as hereinafter defined, by and among the Polk Regional Water Cooperative ("Cooperative"), whose address is 330 W. Church Street, Bartow, FL 33830, City of Auburndale whose address is P.O. Box 186, Auburndale, FL 33823, the City of Bartow whose address is P.O. Box 1069, Bartow, FL 33831, the City of Davenport whose ad-dress is P.O. Box 125, Davenport, FL 33836, the City of Eagle Lake whose address is P.O. Box 129, Eagle Lake. FL 33839, the City of Fort Meade, Florida, a Florida municipal corporation, whose address is P.O. Box 856, Fort Meade, FL 33841, the City of Frostproof whose address is P.O. Box 308, Frostproof, FL 33843, the City of Haines City whose address is 620 E. Main Street, Haines City, FL 33844, the City of Lake Alfred whose address is 120 E Pomelo Street, Lake Alfred, FL 33850, the City of Lake-land whose address is 228 S Massachusetts Ave., Lakeland, FL 33801, the City of Lake Wales whose address is P.O. Box 1320, Lake Wales, FL 33859, the City of Mulberry whose address is P.O. Box 707, Mulberry, FL 33860, Polk City, Florida, a Florida municipal corporation, (fka "City of Polk City") whose address is 123 Broadway Blvd SE, Polk City, FL 33868, the City of Winter Haven whose address is P.O. Box 2277, Winter Haven, FL 33883, the Town of Dundee whose address is P.O. Box 1000, Dundee, FL 33838, the Town of Lake Hamilton whose address is P.O. Box 126, Lake Hamilton, FL 33851 and Polk County ("Polk County"), a charter county and political subdivision of the State of Florida, whose address is P.O. Box 9005, Bartow, Florida 33831, individually also referred to as a "Party" and collectively referred to as the "Parties".

#### RECITALS

- The parties entered into that Interlocal Agreement relating to the Establishment of the Polk Regional Water Cooperative effective June 1, 2016 (hereafter "Charter Interlocal Agreement."
- 2. The purpose of the Charter Interlocal Agreement is to create and establish a separate legal entity, public agency and unit of special purpose local government, pursuant to §§ 163.01(7)(g) and 373.713, Florida Statutes, with all of the privileges, benefits, powers and terms provided in the Charter Interlocal Agreement and by law.
- 3. In its Preamble, the Charter Interlocal Agreement states that "The intent of the Cooperative is to support the right of the Member Governments to keep their existing permitted allocations and to advocate on behalf of the Member Governments with federal, state, regional or local authorities, including, but not limited to legislative bodies and executive agencies regarding matters within the scope of the responsibilities assigned to the Cooperative under this Interlocal Agreement."

- 4. Pursuant to § 1.04(K) of the Charter Interlocal Agreement, the Member Governments agreed that the Cooperative may not exercise any power granted under this Interlocal Agreement within the water service territory of a Member Government so as to interfere with said Member Government's existing water distribution and treatment facilities, existing consumptive use permits or existing water supplies, except with the consent of the Member Government.
- Section 1.04(K) also provided that this provision is supplemental to and shall not be interpreted as limiting the restrictions placed on the Cooperative's exercise of power by Sections 1.04(J), 2.07(D), 2.11(E) and 2.11(F) of the Charter Interlocal Agreement.
- 6. The Preamble and §§ 1.04(J), 1.04(K), 2.01(B), 2.06(A)(35), and 2.06(D) contained in the Charter Interlocal Agreement provides that the Water Cooperative shall advocate and support on behalf of the Member Governments with federal, state, regional or local authorities, including, but not limited to legislative bodies and executive agencies regarding matters within the scope of the responsibilities assigned to the Cooperative under this Interlocal Agreement, including, but not limited to supporting the right of the Member Governments to keep their existing permitted allocations.
- 7. But for the obligation to refrain from entering the water service territories or interfere with existing water distribution and treatment facilities, existing water use permits, or existing water supplies, the City of Fort Meade would not have entered into the Charter Interlocal Agreement.
- The Peace River/Land Use Transmission Project (hereafter "Peace River Project") is one of the Combined Projects identified in the Combined Projects Implementation Agreement.
- 9. Portions of the Peace River Project may be located in the City of Fort Meade's. exclusive chapter 180 Utility Service Area for all water-related utilities created by Fort Meade Ordinance No. 00-26 ("Ordinance No. 00-26"), codified as §§ 24-3 and 24-4 of Article I, Chapter 24, City of Fort Meade City Code.
- 10. The City of Fort Meade has borrowed significant debt based upon the assumption and representation that its exclusive Utility Service Area shall remain free of other utilities.
- 11. As a condition of granting its consent to the permitting, construction and operation of the Peace River Project in its exclusive Utility Service Area, the Parties agree to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.
- 12. The purpose of this Agreement is to protect the City of Fort Meade's rights with regards to the permitting, construction operation of the Peace River Project and to provide Fort Meade's consent to the permitting, construction and operation of the Peace River Project.

- NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained and for other good and valuable consideration, each to the other, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree, stipulate and covenant as follows:
- SECTION 1. RECITALS. The above Recitals are true and correct, and forma material part of this Agreement.
- **SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS**. As used in this Agreement, the following terms shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly requires otherwise:
- 1.1 "Agreement" means this Peace River Project Interlocal Water Plant Consent Agreement, as may be amended or restated from time to time.
- 1.2 "Charter Interlocal Agreement" means that Interlocal Agreement creating the Cooperative, with an effective date of June 1, 2016, including any amendments and supplements thereto.
- 1.3 "Combined Projects Implementation Agreement" means the Combined Projects Implementation Agreement with an effective date of May 1, 2017, including any amendments thereto.
- 1.4 "Cooperative" shall have the same meaning as in the Charter Interlocal Agreement. Pursuant to and in accordance with the Charter Interlocal Agreement, all powers, privileges, and duties vested in or imposed on the Cooperative with regards to the approval and implementation of the Project shall be exercised by the Project Board. Accordingly, references to the "Cooperative" within this Agreement pertaining to the exercise of such powers, privileges, and duties are understood as resulting from the Project Board's exercise of such authority by and on behalf of the Polk Regional Water Cooperative. For purposes of this IAgreement, the Cooperative acts through the Project Board for the Combined Projects Implementation Agreement.
- 1.5 "Director" shall have the same meaning as in the Charter Interlocal Agreement. For purposes of this Agreement, Directors shall be Directors and/or alternates appointed by the Combined Projects Implementation Agreement Project Participants.
- 1.6 "District" means the Southwest Florida Water Management District.
- 1.7 "Effective Date" means the date the Agreement takes legal effect as specified in Section 5.
- 1.8 "Project Board" shall have the same meaning as in the Charter Interlocal Agreement. The Project Board for the Peace River Project will consist of

Directors and/or alternates appointed by the Project Participants to the Combined Projects Implementation Agreement.

1.9 "Project Permits" means all permits, licenses or other third-party approvals necessary or convenient for the acquisition, construction, management or operation of the Peace River Project.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE OF THE AGREEMENT; EFFECT UPON OTHER AGREEMENTS. This Agreement governs the terms and conditions applicable to the City of Fort Meade's grant of consent to the permitting and construction of the Peace River Project in the City of Fort Meade's exclusive Utility Service Area. While the Parties to this Agreement have not yet decided to implement the Peace River Project, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall govern over conflicting terms and conditions of the Combined Project Implementation Agreement with regards to the Peace River Project. Any other agreement between some or all of the Parties not specifically referenced herein is not intended to be changed or affected by this Agreement. Additionally, nothing in this Agreement is intended to change any existing agreement, permit and/or other similar administrative matters between the District and any Party.

SECTION 3. CONSTRUCTION OF TERMS. Terms defined in a given number, tense or form shall have the corresponding meaning when used in this Agreement with initial capitals in another number, tense or form. References containing terms such as "hereof," "herein," "hereto," "hereinafter" and other terms of like import are not limited in applicability to the specific provision within which such references are set forth, but instead refer to this Agreement taken as a whole. "Includes" or "including" shall not be deemed limited to the specific enumeration of items, but shall be deemed without limitation. The term "or" is not exclusive. The headings contained in this Agreement are solely for the convenience of the Parties. Accounting terms used but not defined herein have the meanings given to them under generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America consistently applied throughout the specified period and in the immediately comparable period.

**SECTION 4. REPRESENTATIONS OF THE PARTIES.** As of the Effective Date, each Party makes the following representations (no representation is made by any Party for another Party):

- 4.1 Status of the Parties. The Parties are each duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the State of Florida and are each duly qualified and authorized to satisfy their responsibilities pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4.2 Authority to Enter Agreement. The Parties each have the power, authority and legal right to enter into and perform the obligations set forth in this Agreement, and the execution and delivery and performance hereof by the Parties: (1) has been duly authorized by the governing authority of each of the Parties; (2) does not require any consent or referendum of the voters; and, (3) does not constitute a default under, or result in the creation of any lien, charge, encumbrance or security interest upon,

the assets of the Parties under any agreement or instrument to which the Parties and their assets may be bound or affected, except as otherwise provided herein.

- 4.3 Validity of the Contract. This Agreement has been duly entered into and delivered by the Parties as of the Effective Date, constitutes a legal, valid and binding obligation of the Parties, fully enforceable in accordance with its terms, except to the extent that the enforceability of this Agreement may be limited by any applicable bankruptcy, moratorium, reorganization or other similar laws affecting creditor's rights generally, or by the exercise of judicial discretion in accordance with general principles of equity.
- 4.4 Pending Litigation. There is no action, suit or proceeding, at law or in equity, before or by any court or governmental authority, pending against any Party, wherein an unfavorable decision, ruling or finding would materially and adversely affect the performance by any Party of their obligations hereunder or the other transactions contemplated hereby, or which, in any way, would adversely affect the validity or enforceability of the Agreement.
- SECTION 5. TERM AND TERMINATION. The term of this Agreement shall begin on the Effective Date and remain in effect, unless terminated by written agreement of all the Parties.
- SECTION 6. CONSENT TO FILE PERMITS, DESIGN & CONSTRUCT PEACE RIVER PROJECT. Pursuant to § 180.06, Florida Statutes, the City of Fort Meade hereby grants its consent to the Cooperative acting through the Project Board to apply for and obtain all required Project Permits for the Peace River Project and, to design, construct, maintain and operate the Peace River Project (hereafter "City Consent") subject to the following terms and conditions:
- 6.1 The Parties hereby covenant and agree that they shall take no action or fail to take an action that will result in the loss or reduction of the City of Fort Meade's permitted water use allocation of 759,500 gallons per day, annual average, 1,169,600 gallons per day, peak month and 759,500 gallons per day, drought annual average (hereinafter "Fort Meade Permitted Allocation") authorized by Water Use Permit No. 20 000645.008 dated April 10, 2014 (hereafter "Fort Meade Water Use Permit").
- 6.2. The Parties shall not interfere with Fort Meade Water Use Permit or existing water, wastewater, or reclaimed water facilities of Fort Meade, except as may otherwise be consented to in writing by Fort Meade under this Agreement or some other contract.
- 6.3 The Parties shall not include, list, or seek, either verbally or in writing, any portion of the City of Fort Meade's exclusive Utility Service Area as described in Ordinance No. 00-26 as being a part of the need or to be served in any capacity by the Peace Project in any application for a Project Permit, including but not limited to the water

use permit/allocation applicable to the Peace River Project, nor shall they serve or offer to provide any water service within the City of Fort Meade's exclusive Utility Service Area.

- 6.4 In seeking to obtain any consumptive/water use permit for the Peace River Project, the Parties shall have an affirmative duty to seek to include a condition that specifies that the said permitted water use is not and does not and will not be used as substitute for the Fort Meade Permitted Allocation.
- 6.5 The Parties shall cooperate with each other and no Party to this Agreement shall interfere with the ability of the Cooperative acting through the Project Board to obtain, maintain and comply with any Project Permits so long as that Project Permit does not interfere with the Fort Meade Water Use Permit.
- 6.6 No Party to this Agreement shall purposefully submit information to a regulatory agency that conflicts with information submitted by the Cooperative acting through the Project Board in support of any application for a Project Permit for the Peace River Project, unless the Project Permit directly threatens an existing legal right of a Peace River Project Participant to use the water resources of the state, in existence prior to the date of the Project Permit.
- 6.7 No Party to this Agreement shall legally challenge or support any legal challenge against any proposed or final agency action or any legal instrument with regard to the Peace River Project Permit sought by the Cooperative acting through the Project Board, unless the proposed Project Permit directly threatens an existing legal right of a Peace River Project Participant to use the water resources of the state, in existence prior to the date of the application for the Project Permit.
- 6.8 A Member Government of the Cooperative that is not a Party to this Agreement is not responsible, either directly or indirectly, for compliance with the terms and conditions of any Project Permits nor shall it be liable or responsible, either directly or indirectly, for compliance with the terms and conditions of any Project Permits nor shall it be liable or responsible, either directly or indirectly, for any fines, penalties or damages associated with any Project Permits.
- 6.9 No Party shall take any action or fail to take an action that results in the City of Fort Meade being unable to utilize its existing constructed water treatment plant and wells.
- 6.10 Should the District reduce or terminate the Fort Meade Permitted Allocation as the proximate result of the permitting, construction or operation of the Peace River Project, after the conclusion of all legal proceedings, including but not limited to exhaustion of all reasonable and ethically justifiable appeals, then the Parties shall be responsible for the costs of replacing any such reduced or terminated Fort Meade Permitted Allocation from one of the Alternative Water Supply Projects implemented by the Cooperative.

SECTION 7. DISPUTE RESOLUTION. If there is a dispute between two or more Parties arising out of or related to this Agreement which cannot be resolved, then unless it shall be unreasonable to do so or an emergency situation or necessity dictates otherwise, before proceeding to the default and remedy provisions of this Agreement in Section 8, the affected Parties ("Mediating Parties") shall attempt to resolve the dispute by non-binding mediation. The mediation will be conducted by a mediator mutually agreeable to all Mediating Parties who has experience in mediating disputes of a similar nature. The Mediating Parties will use a procedure agreeable to those Parties and the mediator. The Mediating Parties will mediate in good faith, and will be bound by any resulting mediation agreement that is approved by the governing body for each Party. equally share the costs of mediation and timely pay same. Mediation will commence within thirty (30) days after the date a Party requests mediation of a dispute, or if the agreed mediator is not available within that time period, then at the first opportunity the agreed mediator is available. A Party may not commence litigation of the dispute pursuant to Section 8 until (a) the mediator has declared the Mediating Parties are at an impasse, or (ii) one or all Mediating Parties have terminated the mediation. Among other matters the Parties intend this mediation process as an alternative to the conflict resolution procedure described in the Florida Governmental Conflict Resolution Act. Chapter 164, Florida Statutes.

SECTION 8. DEFAULT AND REMEDY. If any Party fails to observe, comply with, perform or maintain in any material way any term, covenant, condition, duty, obligation, representation or warranty contained or arising under this Agreement, such action shall constitute a default and the other Parties may seek remedies set forth herein, if that default is not timely cured within thirty (30) days, unless such default is capable of being cured within thirty (30) day, in which case the Party must cure the default as soon as practicable. Recognizing the Project Participants' paramount need for a safe and dependable water supply, the Parties agree that the exclusive remedy for default under this Agreement shall be for the non-defaulting Parties to individually or jointly seek specific performance arising from such default.

SECTION 9. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY AND INDEMNIFICATION. The Parties intend to avail themselves of the benefits of Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, and any other statute and common law governing sovereign immunity to the fullest extent possible and nothing herein shall be construed as a waiver of sovereign immunity by these Parties. Additionally, Parties other than the Cooperative are not jointly or severally liable for any torts attributable to the Cooperative and only the Cooperative shall be liable for torts attributable to it or for the torts of its officers, agents, attorneys or employees under this Agreement, and then only to the extent of the waiver of sovereign immunity or limitation specified in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, regardless of whether such claims are grounded in contract, statute, tort, negligence, product liability, strict liability, or otherwise. Finally, the Cooperative agrees to indemnify and hold the other Parties harmless from any injury that the Cooperative, the Project Board or its officers, agents, attorneys, employees or invitees sustain while carrying out the Cooperative's obligations under this Agreement.

SECTION 10. APPLICABLE LAW, VENUE AND WAIVER OF JURY TRIAL. This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the Parties are to be governed by, construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida. In the event of any legal proceeding arising under this Agreement, the exclusive venue for such proceeding shall be either in a State court of competent jurisdiction located in Polk County, Florida or the United States District Court in and for the Middle District of Florida, Tampa Division. In any such legal proceeding, the Parties hereby consent to trial by the court and waive the right to a jury trial as to any issues that are triable before a jury.

#### SECTION 11. NOTICES.

- 11.1 All notices provided for in this Agreement must be in writing and shall be sufficient and deemed to be given when sent by certified mail or registered mail, return receipt requested. A copy shall also be sent to the Party by email. All notices shall be delivered or sent to the Parties at their respective addresses shown in the Combined Projects Implementation Agreement.
  - 11.2 All notices shall also be sent to the Project Board.
- 11.3 Any Party, may, by notice in writing given to the others, designate any further or different addresses to which subsequent notices, certificates or other communications shall be sent. Any notice shall be deemed given on the date such notice is delivered by hand (or facsimile transmission) or three (3) days after the date mailed.
- SECTION 12. DISCLAIMER OF THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARIES. This Agreement is solely for the benefit of the Parties and no right or cause of action shall accrue to or for the benefit of anyone that is not a Party hereto. Nothing in this Agreement, expressed or implied, is intended or shall be construed to confer upon or give any person or entity, other than the Parties any right, remedy or claim under or by reason of this Agreement or any provisions or conditions hereof; and all of the provisions, representations, covenants and conditions herein contained shall inure to the sole benefit of and shall be binding upon the Parties.
- **SECTION 13. AMENDMENT.** The Agreement may only be amended in writing executed by all the Parties.
- **SECTION 14. WAIVER**. No failure by a Party to exercise any right, power or privilege under this Agreement is a waiver of that or any other right, power or privilege under this Agreement, except as otherwise expressly set forth in the Agreement.
- SECTION 15. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Agreement is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, it shall be considered deleted, and shall not invalidate the remaining provisions. However, if the deleted language is considered a key provision of the Agreement, the Parties must agree to a substitute provision that will accomplish the ntent of the Parties. If the Parties cannot agree to a substitute provision

within ninety (90) days of the determination by the court, then the Agreement shall be deemed terminated.

- **SECTION 16. ENTIRE AGREEMENT**. This Agreement, including Exhibits, constitutes the entire contract among the Parties pertaining to the subject matter hereof, and there are no warranties, representations or other agreements in connection with the subject matter hereof, except as specifically set forth herein.
- SECTION 17. EXECUTION OF DOCUMENTS. This Agreement shall be executed in multiple duplicate copies, any of which shall be regarded for all purposes as an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- SECTION 18. AMBIGUITY. The Parties agree that each has played an equal part in negotiation and drafting of this Agreement, and in the event ambiguity should be asserted or realized in the interpretation or construction of this Agreement, the result of such ambiguity shall be equally assumed and realized by each Party.
- SECTION 19. RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES. Nothing herein shall make any Party a partner or joint venturer or create any fiduciary relationship among the Parties.
- **SECTION 20. GOOD FAITH**. The Parties hereto agree to exercise good faith and fair dealings in respect to all matters relating to this Agreement.
- SECTION 21. FURTHER ASSURANCES. The Parties shall use all reasonable efforts to provide such information, execute such further instruments and documents and take actions as may be reasonably requested by another Party and not inconsistent with the provisions of this Agreement and not involving the assumption of obligations or liabilities different from, in excess of, or in addition to those expressly provided for in this Agreement to carry out the intent of this Agreement.
- SECTION 22. PUBLIC RECORDS. Should any Party assert any exemption to, or inapplicability of, the requirements of Chapter 119 and related statutes, the burden and cost of establishing such an assertion, by way of injunctive or other relief as provided by law, shall be upon that Party. The Parties shall allow public access to all Project documents and materials that are subject to the requirements of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes or claim that a document does not constitute a public record, the burden of establishing such an exemption or excluding a document as a public record, by way of injunctive or other relief as provided by law, shall be upon the Party asserting the exemption or the claim that a document does not constitute a public record. Additionally, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed nor is intended to, expand the scope of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes or make into a public record a document that is not a public record under the applicable law.
- SECTION 23. NON-PARTICIPATING MEMBER GOVERNMENTS. This Agreement is not binding upon and cannot negatively affect a Member Government, who

is not a Party to the Agreement nor shall a Member Government, who is not a Party to the Agreement, incur any liability under this Agreement solely by virtue of being a Member Government of the Cooperative.
