Summary of April 9, 2012 City Council Meeting

- Joe LaCascia was elected Mayor of Polk City for the third time.
- Michael Blethen was elected Vice Mayor.
- Ordinance 2012-02 amending Chapter 74 Utilities; amending Section 74-251, deposits required providing for severability; providing for conflicts; providing an effective date - Second and Final Reading. In summary, the water deposit would be \$150 inside or outside the city. Motion Carried: 5 - ayes, 0 - nay
- CDBG Grant Approval to award bid for water line replacement to Empower Construction, Inc.
- Resolution 2012-01, A Resolution of the City Council declaring certain personal property as surplus; providing for authorization for the public sale, subsequent donation or disposal of said personal property; providing for the prior advertisement of said sale; providing for all revenue to be placed in the General Fund; and providing an effective date approved
- Request Approval to use Restricted Funds New Local Option Gas Tax from prior year for street (cash carry-over) approved
