

### Summary of July 9, 2012 City Council Meeting

- Purple Heart City Proclamation making the City of Polk City a Purple Heart City. The Purple Heart Flag was raised on August 7, 2012 at 8:00 AM.
- ORDINANCE 2012-1291, Polk City Solid Waste Management Ordinance. The ordinance was updated and additional detail was added to the existing ordinance. The ordinance was approved on second and final reading.
- Approve repair of pump for the Commonwealth Water Plant. The cost of the repair was \$9,980. City Council requested additional information on the repair.
- City Council authorized execution of contract for Street Rehabilitation Project in the amount of \$106,150.72. All dollars were from restricted cash funds for this purpose.
- Request for Mayor LaCascia and Councilor Block to attend Florida League of Cities Annual Conference August 23 25, 2012.
- Request for updated software (finance, utility billing, business tax, fixed assets, etc.) Further investigation was required before proceeding with this request.
- Set dates for FY 2013 Budget Workshop August 7 at 6:00 PM
- City of Polk City Strategic Planning/Goal Setting date

### Summary of July 28, 2012 - Polk City Strategic Planning and Goals Setting

The Polk City Council met for a full-day session on July 28 for Strategic Planning and Goal Setting. There was lively discussion between all of the City Council Members and City Staff to create a list of goal priorities for Polk City.

#### CITY OF POLK CITY GOAL PRIORITIES

- Develop and implement a marketing plan for Polk City
- o Develop strategies to reduce debt
- o Create a realistic five year capital improvement plan that includes repairs and replacement
- o Enhance website to allow for interaction with and from citizens
- Appoint a charter review committee for possible revisions to the city charter

# Summary of July 30, 2012 Special City Council Meeting

- Repair of Commonwealth Well Pump was approved for \$9,980 to Polk Pump and Irrigation
- Purchase of Computers, Windows 7 and Microsoft Office for the City Staff and City Council. The request was modified to remove 7 tablet computers for the city council decreasing the amount by \$4300. The final amount for hardware, software and installation services was \$14,450.
- Millage rate for the TRIM notice for fiscal year 2013 was proposed at the same rate as 2012 -8.6547 mil. Further discussion and final acceptance of the millage rate will take place in September. This is a decrease to Polk City of \$96,346 in property (ad valorem) taxes if kept at this rate.
- Budget workshop set for Tuesday, August 7, 2012 at 6:00 p.m.
- Update on Purchase of Financial Software the current company is working with the City Staff to improve the functionality of the existing software.

Polk City Senior All-Star softball team (Ages 15-16) won 5/5 games in Naples bringing home to Polk City the State Championship. The team name is proud of its nickname "Hick Chicks with Sticks".

The Polk City "Hick Chicks" is from one of the smallest Little League programs in District 4, and is the first from Polk City to go this far in a Little League tournament. These girls have worked hard to get to this level and Polk City is proud of their achievements. "We decided a long time ago they were not going to beat up on Polk City," said Coach John Manning.

The Polk City "Hick Chicks" were 19-1 in the regular season. They completed a 5-0 winning streak in the state tournament in Naples. Winning pitcher Heather Guy gave up one run on four hits over seven innings. She fanned seven and walked two. Guy, Jenna Manning, Kaitlyn Fulbright, Allyssa Wilson and Lauren Thorn each drove in runs.

Manning said the team is solid with Megan Gatley, Sommer Leavens, Shelby Guitterez, Taylor Byrd, Samantha Trimm, Kaylie Dorminy and Kayla Gatley. "Softball isn't something they do," Manning said. "It's who they are."
