

DISTRICT REPRESENTATION

The proposed Charter Amendment would ensure every area of the city is represented on the Commission.

Currently, Commissioners can live anywhere in the city, even if they all live in the same neighborhood.

If voters adopt the change, Commissioners will have to live in different parts of the city. Polk City would have four equal districts, with one Commissioner each. The fifth commissioner could live anywhere in the city.

Just like today, ALL registered voters would vote for ALL City Commissioners.

In Accordance with Ordinance 1246 (Amended June 2011)

Monthly bills must be paid in full by the due date to avoid disconnection of service and/or service charges. A late fee will be assessed to all accounts not paid in full by the 25th of each month (Sec. 74-257). Delinquent accounts subject to disconnection will be charged a service charge/non-payment fee of \$50.00 if not paid by the 5th after 5:00 pm, and will be disconnected without notice after the 5th. This fee applies to the account prior to disconnection of the Utility Service. (Sec. 74-261). In all cases where water has been disconnected, a reconnection fee of \$55.00 will apply. (Sec. 74-255). FAILURE TO RECEIVE A BILL DOES NOT WAIVE PAST DUE PENALTIES, NON-PAYMENT FEE, OR DISCONNECTION.
